

The Mexican Migration and the Access to Health Care Services. A Binational Perspective from Puebla to the Region of New York State

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Abstract:

This article analyze the difficulties of Migrant workers to access Health Care Services; the existing disparities on the provision of these services to the transnational migrant workers; and finally, when the power and politics are involved, how daily practices and processes produce different categories and classifications influenced by ideological differences about Health Care Services in Mexico and United States. These differences insert migrant workers into two different scenarios. In both of them, they must face structural complications and develop strategies in order to shorten their paths to Heath coverage.
